### TRADITIONAL PROGRAMS

**Boy Scouts** A program for boys ages 11 through 17, designed to achieve the aims of Scouting through a vigorous outdoor program



The mission of the Boy Scouts of America is to prepare young people to make ethical choices over their lifetimes by instilling in them the values of the Scout Oath and Law.



### LEARNING FOR LIFE/EXPLORING

**In-School Programs** Age/Grade appropriate character education curriculum designed to reinforce social, ethical and academic skills in youth.

**Exploring** A co-ed program for ages 14-20, Exploring allows young people to get hands-on experience in a career field of their choice.



**The Scoutreach** mission is to recruit strong adult leaders and to develop solid relationships with chartered organizations (community partners that adopt the Scouting program) in urban and rural communities which ensures that over 6,250 culturally diverse youth have the opportunity to join Scouting through Learning for Life, and traditional programs.

### CUB & BOY SCOUT CAMPING

**Cub Scout Camping** LaSalle Council offered camping experiences to over 2,000 Cub Scout aged boys through *Summer Day Camp*, *Cub and Webelos Resident Camp*, and *Parent/Cub Weekends*, as well as other District events, where they spent valuable time fishing, shooting archery and BB guns, making crafts, hiking and learning new skills.

**Boy Scout Camping** Several thousand Scouts participated in camping activities throughout 2004, including 1,367 youth who attended long-term Summer Camp.



**Venturing** Scouting's co-ed program for youth ages 14 to 20. It includes challenging high-adventure activities, sports, and hobbies for young adults that teach them leadership skills.

**Cub Scouting** A family and home-centered program for boys in first grade through fifth grade. **Tiger Cubs** is the program for first grade boys and their adult partners that stresses shared leadership. **Cub Scouts** is for boys in the second and third grades. Fourth and fifth grade boys are called **Webelos** (WE'll BE LOyal Scouts) and participate in more advanced activities that begin to prepare them to become Boy Scouts.

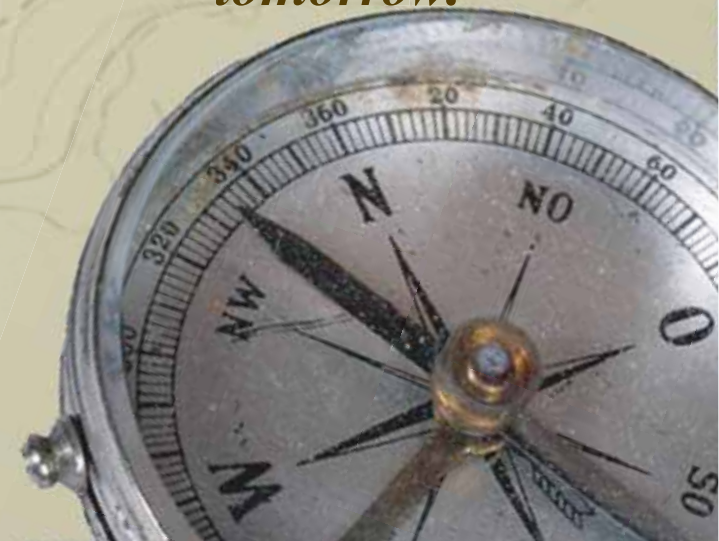
