Geocaching for Scouts

Geocaching is a world wide game of Hide and Seek using GPS units. The main object in the public sector is to go to www.geocaching.com and get the coordinates of a Cache. Then the object is to find the Cache.

A Cache is a container, Film canister, ammo box...etc. The object is to put trinkets, toys, coins, scout patches into your Cache, then hide it someplace accessible. Put a note pad and pencil in your cache so others can log their find. In a public place, you can hide your cache and post your Cache Coordinates on the Geocaching web site.

FOR THE SCOUTS:

The Boy Scouts have permission from the Rangers at Wood Lake, Topenebee, Rice Woods to place Caches on their properties. These will be kept private from the public, due to needing permission to enter the property. You will be able to log your cache with the webmaster of LaSalle Council.

Rules:

Keep the contents of the Scout Property Caches' Scout related. Do place your cache some place accessible where you don't have to beat a new path to it. When Geocaching, remember to respect nature, other Troop's campsites, and that all council and camp rules apply.

Maintain your cache. Log your Cache coordinates on the council website by notifying the Camp Ranger and email to xonxoff2002@comcast.net, who will keep the list up to date.
